Pentecostalism

- Developed from Pre-Millennial and early dispensationalist movements of late 19th century.
- Charles Parham of Topeka Bible Institute taught that speaking in tongues was a sign of the baptism of the Holy Spirit on January 1, 1901.



Pentecostalism

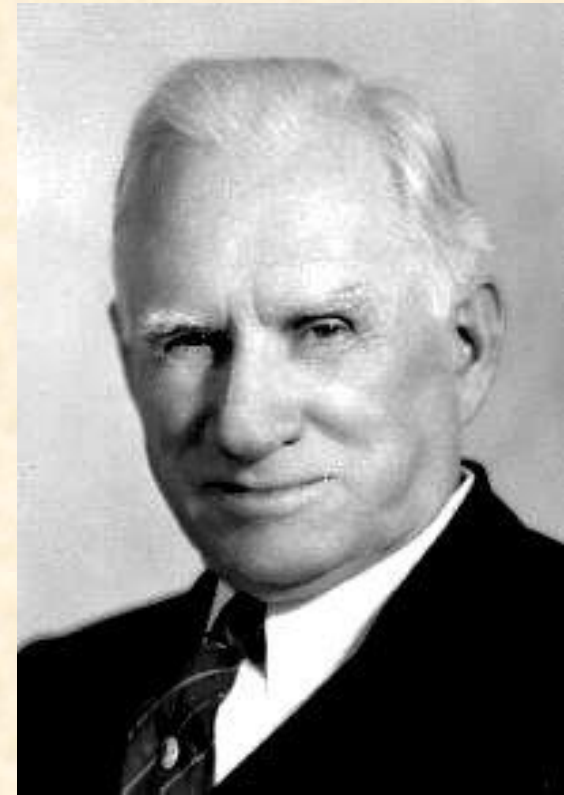
- Early Pentecostals believed they were in the End Times of Joel 2:28
- William Seymour attended Bible classes in Houston taught by Parham.
- Seymour led the Asuza Street Revival 1906 in Los Angeles.
- Required a response from dispensationalists.



William R. Newell

1868 - 1956

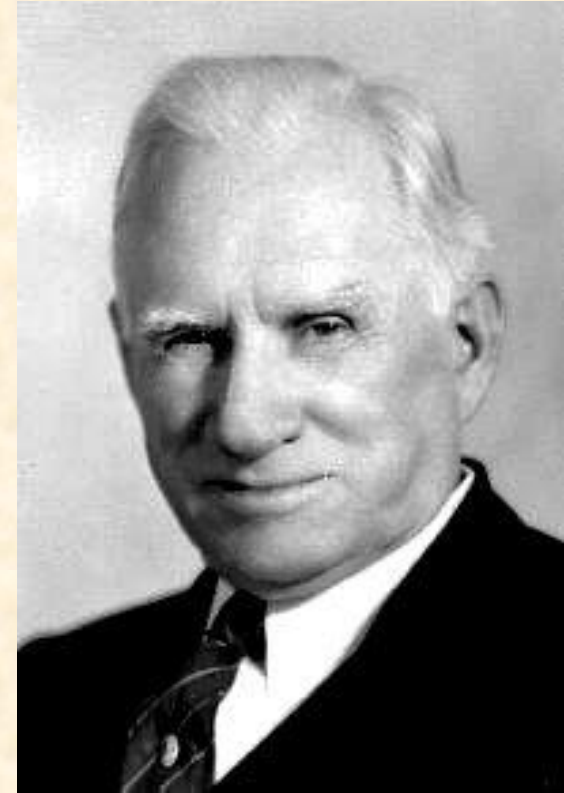
- Graduated in 1891 from Wooster College, studied at Princeton and Oberlin.
- Became a pastor in Chicago
- Became the superintendent of Moody Bible Institute in 1895



William R. Newell

1868 - 1956

- Became widely known as a Bible teacher
- Published commentary on Romans
- Taught about the “one baptism prior to O’Hair
- Moved to Leesburg, FL in 1910.
- Wrote the hymn “At Calvary”



John Cowen (J.C.) O'Hair

1876 - 1958

- Born in Little Rock, Ark., 3rd of 12 children
- Saved in Neen, LA 1899 through the testimony of his landlady and future wife.



John Cowen (J.C.) O'Hair

1876 - 1958

- Worked as the secretary to the US Ambassador to Mexico.
- Married in 1901
- Entered the ministry in 1916
- Worked as a developer.



John Cowen (J.C.) O'Hair

1876 - 1958

- 1917 went to Oak Park, IL
- Discovered the truth “One baptism” in Indianapolis around 1921 while preaching against Pentecostalism.



John Cowen (J.C.) O'Hair

1876 - 1958

- 1921 visited the North Shore Church in Chicago. Became the pastor in 1923.
- Started a radio ministry in 1924.



John Cowen (J.C.) O'Hair

1876 - 1958

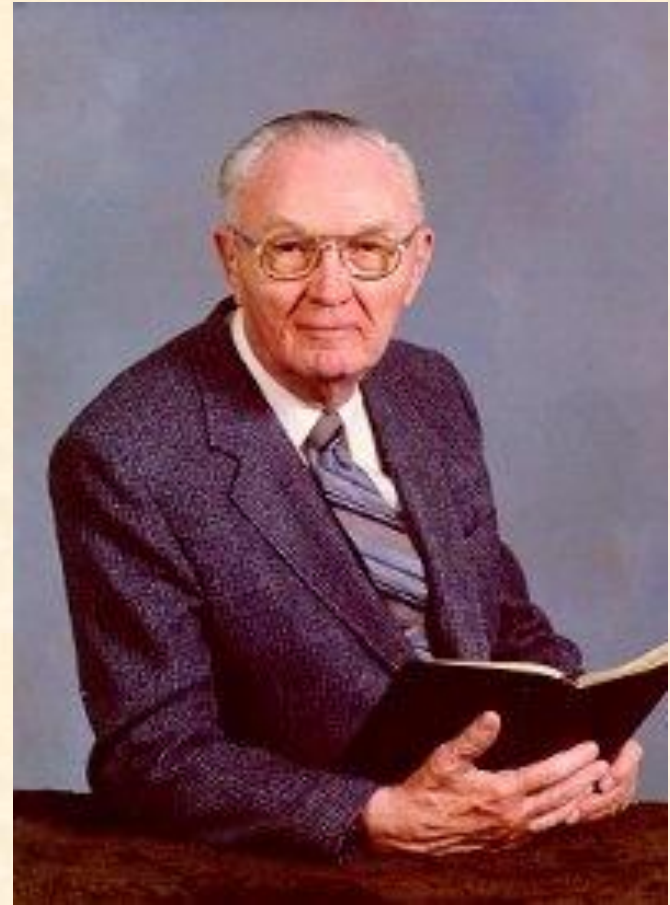
- Published hundreds of books, pamphlets and tracts.
- Most influential early leader of the US Grace Movement.



Cornelius R. Stam

1908-2003

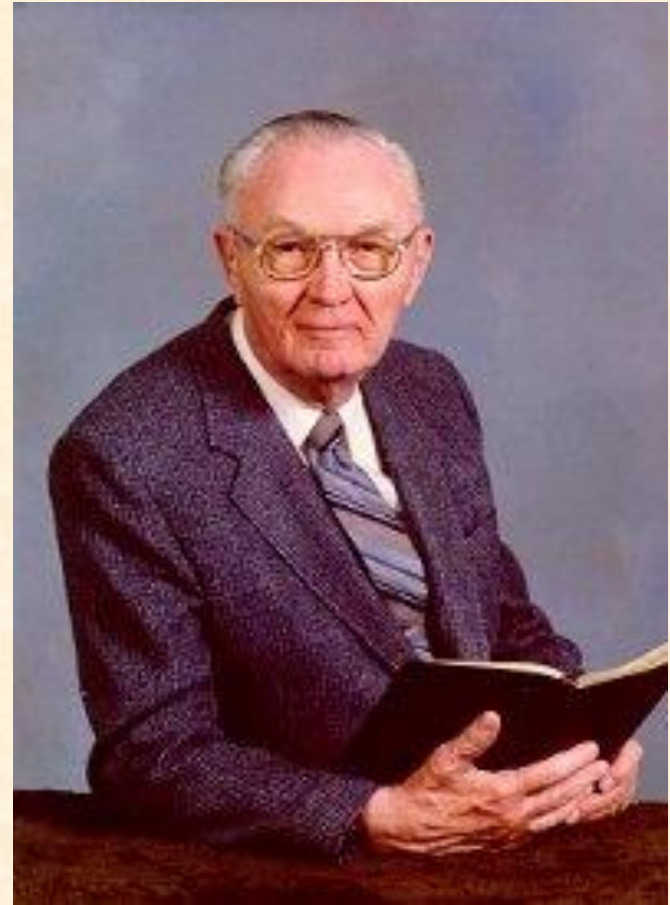
- Raised in Paterson N.J. where his father founded Star of Hope Mission.
- Brother of John Stam, missionary martyr.



Cornelius R. Stam

1908-2003

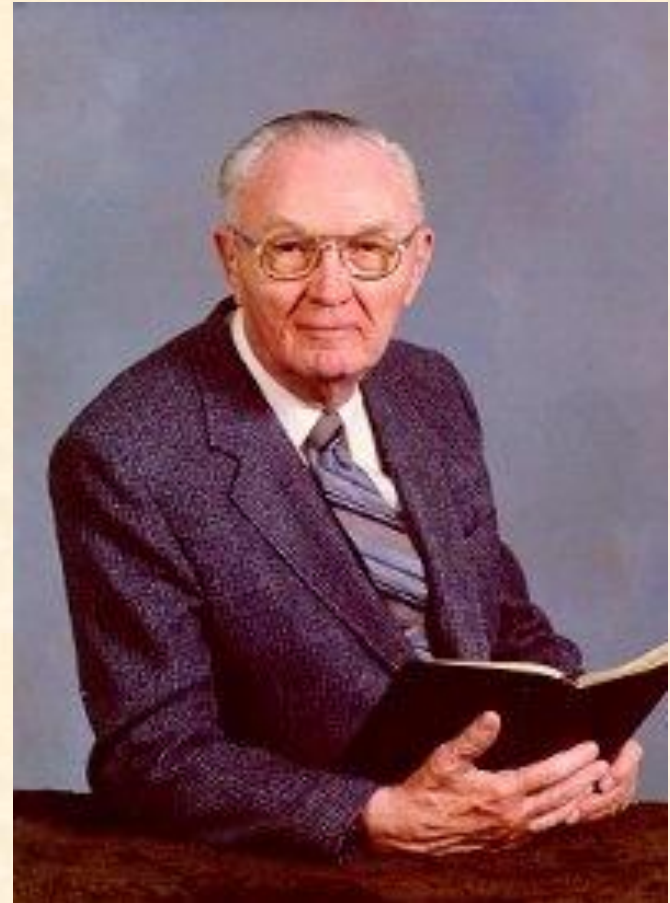
- Pastor of Preakness Community Church until 1944
- 1926 came to understand Mid-Acts dispensationalism through O'Hair books.



Cornelius R. Stam

1908-2003

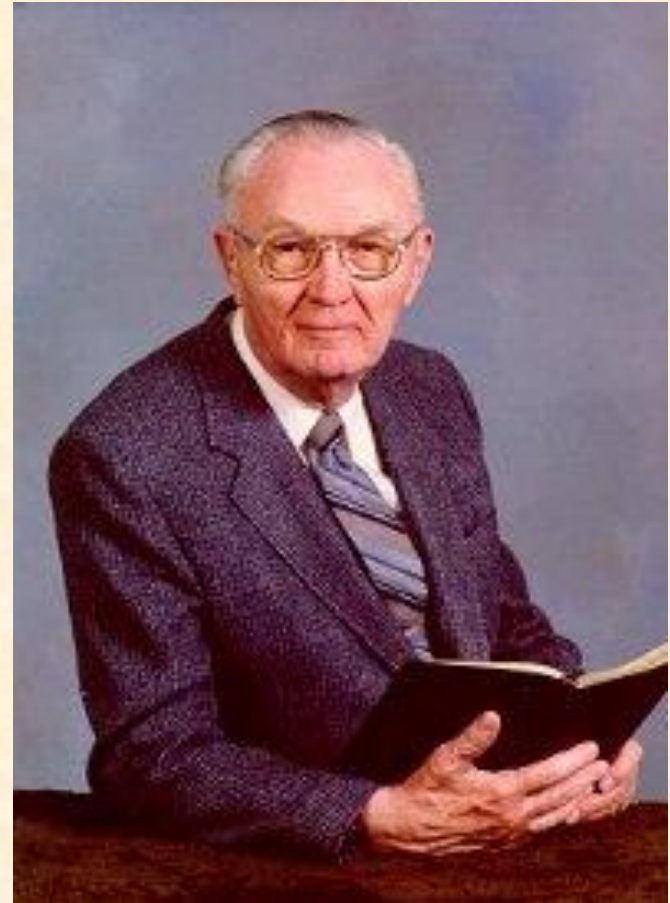
- In Preakness he founded the Berean Bible Society.
- Around 1944 he left NJ to work as field representative for Worldwide Grace Testimony.



Cornelius R. Stam

1908-2003

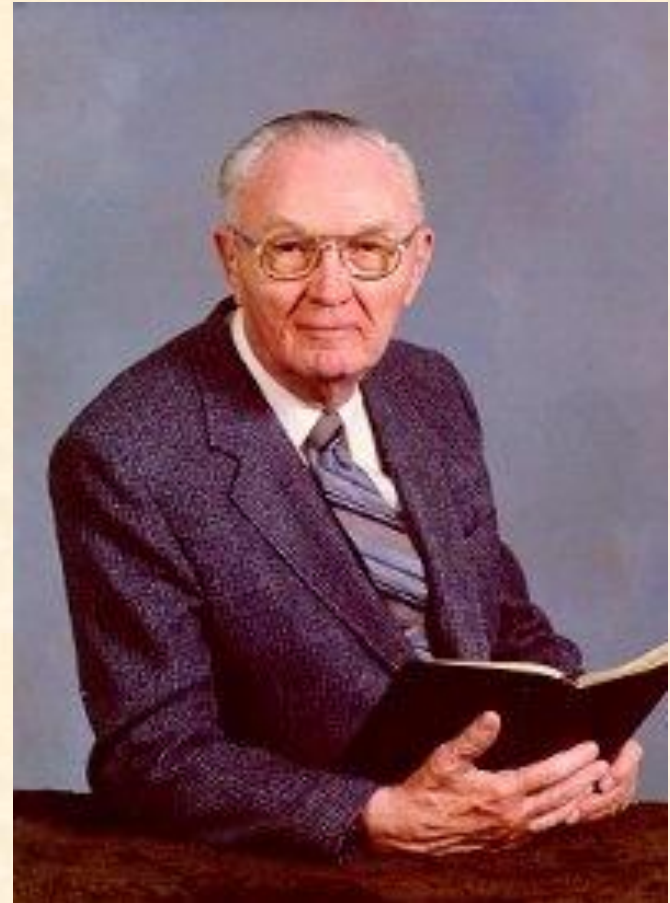
- 1945 became dean of Milwaukee Bible Institute.
- 1953 Stam left MBI and moved to Berean Bible Society to Chicago. Was pastor of North Shore Church



Cornelius R. Stam

1908-2003

- Was pastor of North Shore Church after O'Hare's death



Cornelius R. Stam

1908-2003

- Continuously published the Berean Searchlight
- Things that Differ was most influential introduction to Mid-Acts Dispensationalism



Cornelius R. Stam

1908-2003

- Controversial and contentious personality
- Largely responsible for divisions in the Grace Movement and Berean Bible Fellowship.
